



Today, the Singapore furniture trade is a significant billiondollar industry that adds robustness and diversity to Singapore's economy. It boasts over 2,000 companies employing more than 14,000 workers and in 2005, generated exports worth almost S\$1.6 billion.

Over the past year, we have kept up our momentum carrying out initiatives under the Furniture Industry Capability Upgrading Programme, particularly in the areas of international marketing and trade development as well as talent spotting, skills upgrading and training. We have partnered government agencies and trade organisations on new initiatives that benefit our members and promote the growth of the industry.

To encourage business globalisation and the exchange of international best trade practices, business missions to Italy, USA, Malaysia and Vietnam as well as members'

expeditions to world renowned international fairs like the imm Cologne, International Furniture Fair Tokyo and Index Dubai were organised.

The Council also strives to continuously brand and showcase ourselves as a furniture trade powerhouse and Singapore as an effective business and design hub for the global furniture industry.

This year, the International Furniture Fair Singapore 2006/23rd ASEAN Furniture Show attracted a record number of international exhibitors and trade visitors. Spot orders for the five-day event reached US\$240 million. The event also garnered an estimated US\$32 million in economic spin-offs for Singapore's MICE (Meetings, Incentives, Conventions and Exhibitions) and tourism industries. Next year, the inaugural World of Woodworking Machinery will expand the scope of the furniture show and make it the biggest annual trade event in Singapore.

Raising the design bar in Singapore and giving ourselves a creative edge over other global players has always weighed high on the Council's agenda. As such, we have been relentless in organising design related platforms to promote design excellence, nurture talents as well as enhance the exposure to and appreciation of furniture designs and innovations in Singapore. With expert inputs from our International Furniture Design Advisory Panel, I am heartened that many of our design initiatives like the annual Furniture Design Award, FLIP! Challenge and Furniture Design Forum have achieved much credibility and a strong following in the industry.

The SFIC has also worked hand-in-hand with related agencies and training providers to develop suitable curricula at the Furniture Learning Institute to increase the value-add of workers.

Under the 2nd Member Assistance Scheme from October 2003 to June 2006, up to \$1.3 million was provided to help members offset the cost of participating in SFIC activities and other approved programmes. In March 2006, the SFIC embarked on a three-year development blue print under the multi-government agencies' Local Enterprise and Association Development (LEAD) Programme. The Singapore furniture industry was given yet another shot in the arm with \$16 million dedicated to improve the overall capabilities of SMEs, optimising human capital and raising the industry's profile and capabilities globally.

Under the LEAD Programme, the SFIC has rolled out initiatives such as the Designer Co-Development Programme whereby young design talents will be offered a one-year employment contract with some of



Singapore's leading furniture companies. The Designer Entrepreneur Development Programme, aptly known as 'PLATFORM', is another initative that offers promising furniture designers a costeffective platform to showcase their new prototypes and find fruitful partnerships with potential manufacturers during the annual IFFS/AFS. Through an Exporters Mentoring Programme, we will groom more local furniture SMEs as

furniture exporters to increase the pool of "Singapore brand ambassadors" in the global market and intensify the marketing of the industry's offerings and capabilities.

In addition, the development of the International Furniture Centre (IFC) is another major initiative that will be supported under the LEAD Programme. Slated to be launched in mid 2007, the IFC aims to consolidate Singapore's role as an effective Asian business conduit for the international furniture trade. Some of the Centre's areas of enhancement include strategic business matching, design development, market development trips overseas and buying programmes to Singapore.

An exciting time lies ahead in the next three years as we embark on a journey that is set to 'LEAD' the industry and transform Singapore into a major furniture marketing and design hub.

The success that we enjoy today is the culmination of everyone's efforts. I am glad

to have played my part in helping SFIC achieve its milestones as it crosses the quarter century mark. This year also marks my last term as the President of SFIC and I would like to take this opportunity to thank the various government ministries, statutory boards and the media for their strong support and cooperation all these years. Kudos also goes to the Council's Executive Committee and functional committee members as well as the secretariat staff for their unwavering commitment and dedication. As I pass the baton on to the next President to continue the illustrious chapters of SFIC, I hope you will continue to pledge your fullest support to the Council and join us in redefining the future of the Singapore furniture industry.
