SFIC Delegation to Embark on Sustainability Business Model Transformation Mission Trip to Tokyo, Japan

SINGAPORE, 23 APR 2023 — SFIC, with the support of Enterprise Singapore (EnterpriseSG), will be leading 18 delegates from 14 organisations on a Sustainability Business Model Transformation Mission to Tokyo, Japan from the 23rd to 29th of April 2023.

Since the launch of its Furniture Sustainability Programme in 2022, SFIC has been consistently promoting sustainable practices in the Singapore furniture industry, with various initiatives such as the Sustainability Leaders Programme (SLP) and Sustainability Leaders Recognition (SLR), that spotlights first movers in the industry that have displayed exemplary sustainable practices.



The trade association has also embarked on international learning journeys to help furniture companies look at ways to transform their business models and build capabilities to capture new opportunities that the sustainability agenda brings. Last year, SFIC embarked on its inaugural mission to Denmark in June, and the upcoming Tokyo mission will be another step towards achieving SFIC's sustainability goals and building a more sustainable future for the furniture industry. Through the exchange of information and experiences of global trends and best practices with related experts and leaders in the markets, such mission trips also aim to help companies build new knowledge and foster potential partnerships with relevant stakeholders. This is in line with the SFIC 2025 Roadmap to position the Singapore furniture industry as the nexus of tomorrow's work-life integration for sustainable urban living.

Japan identified as a sustainability leader from SFIC's Sustainability Blueprint research

Japan leads Asia on the 2021 Sustainable Development Report, ranking 18th globally and is committed to achieving a circular economy and net-zero emissions by 2050. The Japanese furniture industry is a significant part of the country's economy, with a focus on high-quality and innovative designs. Traditional Japanese furniture is known for its minimalist style and use of natural materials. In recent years, there has been a trend towards sustainable and eco-friendly materials as well as production. The Japanese government's support for the industry includes initiatives such as funding for research and development, tax incentives for eco-friendly production and overseas business expansion.

With Singapore and Japan facing similar urban challenges and demographics, Japan has been highlighted in SFIC's Sustainability Blueprint as a potential country of interest to take reference from for learning.

During the mission, the Singapore delegation will visit various sustainable furniture companies such as Okamura Corporation and Kokuyo Co Ltd, two reputable TYO-listed office furniture manufacturers in Japan, attend sharing sessions on sustainable business practices from organisations like Zero Waste Japan, and meet with multiple Japanese furniture industry leaders to learn more about their sustainability initiatives, amongst them relevant associations such as the Japan Office Furniture Association (JOIFA) and the Japan Furniture Industry Development Association (JFA). The delegation will also be visiting the Singapore Pavilion exhibiting at ORGATEC Tokyo, a furniture fair dedicated to the commercial and home office industries for the Asia-Pacific market.

The objectives of the Tokyo mission include:

• Understanding more about the philosophy, production/design process and business case behind more sustainable Japanese furniture and furnishings



- Gain inspiration and garner best practices for how companies might work more constructively towards becoming the nexus of tomorrow's work-life integration for sustainable urban living -- in line with the SFIC Vision for 2025
- Explore potential partnerships with Japanese furniture industry players that are sustainability leaders in the region.

"Our Sustainability Business Model Transformation Mission to Japan is a testament to our commitment to promoting sustainable practices and driving positive change within our industry. Japan is globally renowned to be one of Asia's sustainability leaders in the furniture space. We hope to enable our members to learn the unique approaches to sustainability by Japanese industry leaders and at the same time, share our insights and foster collaboration between Singapore and Japanese companies and organisations," said Mr. Phua Boon Huat, President of SFIC.

Said Ms. Sarah Ler, Director for Retail and Design, EnterpriseSG, "In order to drive its circular economy, Japan has implemented a Public-Private Partnership approach, particularly for initiatives that have significant potential for development impact but may face funding challenges from traditional financial institutions. Japan's approach to sustainable development, technological advancements, certification standards, and cross-sector partnerships are great learning opportunities for Singapore furniture companies to adopt sustainable practices and transform their business models. This will enable them to build a sharper competitive edge that allows them to capture new trends in the furniture space."
